What is Beech Bend Park?

Beech Bend Park is a multi-attraction destination just outside Bowling Green. It combines an amusement park, water park (Splash Lagoon), raceway, and 411 site campground – so whether you're after thrills, relaxation, or the open air, it's got something for everyone.

Campsite

- **Complimentary Campsite-** In exchange for a 32-hour weekly work commitment, you'll receive a full hookup campsite (water, electric, and sewer; 30- or 50-amp) at no charge.
- **Housing-** Workampers must provide their own housing, such as an RV, fifth wheel, motorhome, or skoolie.
- **Mobility Requirement-** A vehicle capable of moving your camper must be available at all times while staying in the campground. This vehicle must be provided by the Workamper.
- **Additional Occupants-** Any household members age 18+ who are not employed by Beech Bend will be charged \$50 per month.
- **Campground Amenities-** Two bathhouses with restrooms and showers; Coin-operated laundromat (located in one bathhouse)
- **Wireless internet available for an additional fee**

Arrival-

Workampers may begin arriving as early as mid-April 2026. All arrivals must check in at the Campground Office before going to their site. The office is open 24 hours a day for your convenience. At check-in, you will complete campground registration and provide the following:

**Workampers who stay through the end of the season will have five days after their final commitment date to vacate their campsite. After this time, standard daily campground rates will apply.
(Final departure date may vary based on the official season calendar.)**

Positions

Beech Bend Park provides overtime pay, so you may work additional hours above the required 32 hours if you choose to. You will be paid weekly. Our pay period is Monday through Sunday, with pay day being on the following Thursday. You will get the choice of being paid by either Direct Deposit or via Pay card (will be provided). Workampers may apply for any available position that they wish, but here as some of the most popular jobs:

Supervisory roles are available in each department

Food Service Team Member: Ages 14+

Duties and Responsibilities: Cashiers are responsible for placing orders, taking payments, and preparing orders to serve to customers quickly and professionally. Line Cooks must operate and properly maintain all cooking equipment and its corresponding prep station in order to keep a clean and safe work environment. All employees must maintain the highest level of customer service standards, while escalating all customer concerns and complaints to higher management. It is important that one obtains knowledge of the park facilities and amenities in order to assist customers. Cashiers must be able to count money and make change, as well as receiving cash, credit/debit cards, vouchers, etc. as payments. Various other duties and responsibilities are assigned.



Qualifications: Must be at least 14 years old; 16 years old to be a prep cook. Excellent verbal communication and basic math skills a must. Needs to be aware, attentive, work well with others, and willing to accept guidance and supervision. Ability to stand for extended periods of time. Will need to complete a food handling course, which will be provided. Must be available to work on operating holidays and weekends.

Rides Team Member: Ages 16+

Duties and Responsibilities: Ride operators are responsible for operating ride controls in all weather conditions. They must verbally communicate and enforce safety rules. Assist guests in entering/exiting ride vehicles. Will test safety equipment prior to ride operations. Maintain a calm demeanor and act quickly in emergency situations. Visually observes guests and ride in order to prevent safety hazards and ensure safety equipment is intact. Ensure friendly interactions with guests. Maintain a clean ride environment. Complete a “safety scan” as required to ensure operational safety. Follow safety standards at all times.



Qualifications: Must be at least 16 years old. Must be willing to work in a team environment and be willing to accept guidance and supervision. Must remain attentive and alert at all times. Ability to work in all weather conditions and take the proper health precautions to ensure personal health safety. Ability to comprehend instructions and retain information. Must enforce park regulations and policies (height restrictions, weight restrictions, riding positions, etc.) Willingness to work in any assigned attractions area and perform other functions as assigned. Must maintain a friendly composure with guests and willingness to help answer any questions they may have. Ability to sit/ stand for extended periods of time. Must be available to work on operating holidays and weekends.

Guest Arrival Team Member: Ages 14+

Duties and Responsibilities: Team members will be responsible for a number of tasks including selling daily admissions, season passes, and other admission passes while also attempting to up sale products. Sales include gift shop merchandise and renting products/facilities to guests. They will also be responsible for merchandising and maintaining sale displays/sales floor in order to promote the best experience possible for guests. They will receive payment via cash, credit, debit, and/or vouchers. One must remain knowledgeable of current promotional offers as well as knowledge of the facility in order to assist guests. It is important that the team member enforces all park policies and procedures while maintaining the highest level of customer service to our guests.



Qualifications: Must have basic computer and math skills in order to balance register and give correct change. Have a friendly and outgoing personality in order to promote the best guest experience possible. Needs to be able to work well with others and willing to accept guidance and supervision. Ability to sit/ stand for extended periods of time. Must be available to work on operating holidays and weekends.

Lifeguard 15+

Duties and Responsibilities: Establish protection standards by supervising and surveying swimmers. Performing water rescues when needed. Providing basic first aid and emergency care. Be knowledgeable and enforce the rules and regulations of the waterpark (such as height/weight restrictions, proper riding equipment, etc.) Attend in-service on a weekly basis to maintain skills and certifications. Communicate with management, employees, and guests via whistles, hand signals, and radios. Remain attentive at all times and maintaining a professional image. Be able to provide superior guest services by composing yourself in a polite, professional manner. Be knowledgeable of park policies and procedures in order to assist customers with all questions about the facilities layout and amenities. Maintaining a neat and clean environment by assisting in waterpark beautification at the end of each day.



Qualifications: Must be at least 15 years of age.
No prior Lifeguard certification required.
Training course offered through Beech Bend Park. Ability to communicate effectively to guests and staff members and accept guidance and supervision. Ability to work in extreme weather conditions is a must, as well as being responsible enough to take the appropriate health precautions such as staying hydrated and applying sun-protection. It is extremely important that the Lifeguard be aware and attentive to guests to ensure their safety. Must be available to work on operating holidays and weekend

Slide Attendant 16+

Duties and Responsibilities: Slide Attendants are responsible for operating the top and bottom of waterslides. They must be able to enforce facility and water slide rules in order to ensure the safety of guests. They will work closely with co-workers in order to signal and communicate when riders may safely enter/exit their slide/tube. Must be able to respond quickly and accurately. Be able to provide superior guest services by composing yourself in a polite, professional manner. Be knowledgeable of park policies and procedures in order to assist customers with all questions about the facilities layout and amenities. Maintaining a neat and clean environment by assisting in waterpark beautification at the end of each day.



Qualifications: Ability to communicate effectively to guests and staff members and accept guidance and supervision. Ability to work in extreme weather conditions is a must, as well as being responsible enough to take the appropriate health precautions such as staying hydrated and applying sun-protection. It is extremely important that the Slide Attendants be aware and attentive to guests to ensure their safety. Must be available to work on operating holidays and weekend

Wages & Bonuses

- **Food Service, Cashier 1 (14yrs and older): \$9.50/hr to \$12.50/hr. depending on experience**
- **Food Service, Cook (16yrs and older): \$12.50 to \$13/hr. depending on experience**
- **Ticketing and Retail (14yrs and older): \$9.50/hr. to \$12.50/hr. depending on experience**
- **Ride Operations (16yrs and older): \$12.50/hr. to \$13.00/hr. depending on experience**
- **Slide Attendant (16yrs and older): \$11.00/hr.to \$11.50/hr. depending on experience**
- **Lifeguard (15yrs and older): \$12.50/hr.to \$13.25/hr. depending on experience**

The season end bonus is available only to seasonal Workampers. The bonus is based on starting date of employment and is earned only IF you are a team member in good standing (i.e. You must arrive to work on time, wearing proper uniform, and having no write-ups during bonus period) and you work every operating day beginning with our last operating week day and continuing through our last operating day of the season. You cannot miss any of those days unexcused and qualify for the bonus. You cannot have more than 2 excused absences during the bonus period and qualify for the bonus. Excusable absences are dependent on Upper Management's discretion, but will include medical excuses. Bonus information is as follows:

Bonus amount is \$.75 per hour for every hour worked from May 1st until end of season up to \$500. If you quit during the season and are re-hired, the bonus calculation starts all over on the date of rehire.

What is my Uniform?



Beech Bend Park provides each team member with one name tag. Uniform shirts are \$13 each and are deducted through payroll deduction. Uniform shorts are \$22 each and are deducted through payroll deduction. Both pants and shorts must be tan/khaki in color and must be Docker style. No denim type or stretchy or tight fitting material permitted. Carpenter, painter, baggie, sweatpants, hip hugger, yoga or jogging type pants are not permitted. Pants can't be skin tight. Pants must not touch the ground. Shorts must be past finger-tip length when arms are at sides. Black or brown belts may be worn.

Clean, low-cut, full-toed, lace-up tennis-type shoes in good condition must be worn. Shoes must be white with white laces or black with black laces. Eighty percent of the shoe must be white or black. No neon is allowed. High tops, toms and Sperry-type shoes are not permitted. Shoes must have a back on them – straps do not count as a back.
